

- North London Waste Authority has unveiled further details of the North London Heat and Power Project – a replacement for the Edmonton Energy from Waste facility
- It's where non-recyclable waste from north London households will be turned into energy – heat and power
- Consultation will run from **18 May to 30 June 2015**

What are we proposing?

The North London Heat and Power Project is our proposal to build an Energy Recovery Facility to replace the existing plant at the Edmonton EcoPark by 2025, so we can recover energy – heat and power – from the household waste left over after recycling.

We consulted on our outline proposals from 30 November 2014 to 27 January 2015. Now we are consulting on further detail and want to hear your views.

Energy Recovery Facility – this will replace the existing Energy from Waste plant.

Resource Recovery Facility – where bulky waste will be separated for recycling. Anything left over will be used as fuel to generate heat and power. It will also be a recycling centre for the public and businesses from 2021.

EcoPark House – a visitors' centre where people can find out more about recycling, waste, heat and power. It will also be home to the Edmonton Sea Cadets.

Associated development – new access points and a temporary construction laydown area.




Image: Proposed site layout

Why a replacement?

The current facility has served north London for 45 years and has diverted 21 million tonnes of waste from landfill, but is due to reach the end of its life in around 10 years.
